From the Vicar . . .

Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen indeed! Alleluia!

My dear siblings in Christ, Easter is a wonderful season - 50 days of celebration of the new life we have all received through the death and resurrection of Christ. And during this season, it's been an honor to lead a study of stewardship and our stories with you all. We meet in the Gernert room at 9:30 for a look in scripture, finding stewardship in some unique ways.

The first story we looked at was the story of the 6th day of creation- specifically when God created human beings and gave us dominion over the rest of the world. Dominion has always been a word that bothered me, because of the negative connotations I have with the term domination. Throughout study, though, I came to realize that the ways in which we are called to have dominion over the earth are the same ways in which God has dominion over us. We are called to love and care for creation, helping it live fully into what God has made it to be.

This was an especially fitting study as April 22 was Earth Day, a day in which we celebrate the creation God has given us and think about how we might be better stewards, or caretakers. Here are a couple of ideas to get you started thinking, and I'd love to hear other ideas!

Recycling everything that you can- paper, plastic, aluminum, glass

Using a reusable straw- in America, we use upwards of 500 million plastic straws a day, and they can easily end up in our oceans. Instead of a disposable plastic straw, try using a stainless steel straw, reusable plastic straw, or compostable paper straw

Turn off lights when you leave a room- this saves energy (and saves you money!)

What other ideas do you have to help steward our creation? Do you have a story of stewardship of creation you'd be willing to share? Make sure you come to Sunday school May 20th for a day of storytelling with one another!



The Golden Circle

So, what's up with the circles? If you've been in the Corner Conference room, you might have seen a big sheet of paper with three circles on it. It looks something like this:




This is called the Golden Circle and Pastor Pam brought this concept back with her from a continuing education event. It asks us to start with the question Why? Often, when we come together for meetings, we're focused on the whats: what needs to be done for this event to happen? Or the hows: how many paper plates do we need for this dinner? Starting with the question why, we are able to spend more time focusing on the reasons we're doing something, which can then help shape the hows and the whats.

Here's an example of how the Welcome All team used the Golden Circle with regards to the Easter Breakfast. Together, we brainstormed all of the different reasons, the whys, we have an Easter Breakfast. Some of the answers were along these lines: to provide hospitality, it's a festival day, to celebrate together, and another 15 or 20 responses. So we then took all of the different whys, and brainstormed how we might accomplish these whys. No answers were too outrageous to be heard! We latched pretty quickly onto the idea of doing something to share our Easter festivities with our siblings at St. Paul's. And from those ideas, the whats of Easter baskets for kids and gift cards for moms came to fruition, which we delivered last Sunday.

When we start with the question why, we are able to consider our motivations behind a project and see how it connects to our vision, mission, and value statements. We are able to consider new ways of doing old projects, and we grow in our understanding of who we are as a community. So, when you have a project in mind to bring to one of the teams, start with why.
